

Grant Title: RUTH L. KIRSCHSTEIN NATIONAL RESEARCH SERVICE AWARDS (NRSA)
INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH TRAINING GRANTS (T32)

Grant Number: PA-08-226

Area of Research: Support for graduate and postdoctoral research training.

Release and Expiration: Aug 01, 2008 release; Sep 08, 2011 expiration.

Application Deadlines: January 25, May 25, September 25 annually.

Amount: *Annual Stipend:* \$20,772 (predoctoral), \$36,996 (postdoctoral); Tuitions, Fees: The rate currently provides 60% of the level requested by the applicant institution, up to \$16,000 per year per predoctoral trainee. If the program supports formally combined dual-degree training (e.g., M.D.-Ph.D., D.D.S.-Ph.D.), the amount provided per trainee will be up to \$21,000 per year. For postdoctoral trainees, an amount equal to 60% of the level requested by the applicant institution, up to \$4,500 per year, will be provided; *Travel:* To scientific meetings, workshops, and research training experiences; Training Related Expenses on Institutional Training Grants (including health insurance): Predoctoral Trainees: \$4,200 annually, Postdoctoral Trainees: \$7,850 annually; Institutional Allowance for Individual Fellows Sponsored by non-Federal Public, Private, and Non-Profit Institutions (Domestic & Foreign, including health insurance): Predoctoral Fellows: \$4,200, Postdoctoral Fellows: \$7,850

Length of Support: Up to five years. Because the nature and scope of the proposed research training will vary from application to application, the size and duration of each award will also vary. The total amount awarded and the number of awards will depend upon the number, quality, duration, and costs of the applications received

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, Private institutions of higher education, Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized), Public and State controlled institutions of higher education, Native American tribal organizations (other than Federally recognized tribal governments).

Agency/ Department: Department of Health and Human Services, National Institutes of Health (NIH)

Summary: The National Institutes of Health (NIH) will award Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (NRSA) Institutional Research Training Grants (T32) to eligible institutions as the primary means of supporting predoctoral and postdoctoral research training to help ensure that a diverse and highly trained workforce is available to assume leadership roles related to the Nation's biomedical, behavioral and clinical research agenda. The primary objective of the T32 program is to prepare qualified individuals for careers that have a significant impact on the health-related research needs of the Nation. This program supports predoctoral, postdoctoral and short term research training programs at domestic institutions of higher education with the T32 funding mechanism.
