

**Grant Title:** NIMH RESEARCH EDUCATION GRANTS (R25)

**CFDA:** PAR-08-079 (CFDA number 93.242)

**Area of Research:** Foster the development of mental health researchers via creative and innovative research educational programs.

**Release and Expiration:** January 18, 2008 release; January 8, 2010 expiration.

**Application Deadline:** *Letters of Intent:* 30 days before the submission date. *Full application:* September 25 annually for new, resubmission, renewal, and revision applications; January 7th annually for AIDS applications

**Amount:** Up to \$250,000 per year

**Length of Support:** Up to 5 years

**Eligible Applicants:** Private or Public/State Controlled Institutions of Higher Education; Hispanic-serving Institutions; Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs); Tribally Controlled Colleges and Universities (TCCUs); Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Serving Institutions; Nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) IRS Status (Other than Institutions of Higher Education); Small Businesses; For-Profit Organizations (Other than Small Businesses); State, County, City, Township, or Special District Governments; Indian/Native American Tribal Governments (Federally Recognized or otherwise) or Tribally Designated Organizations; Independent School Districts; Public Housing Authorities/Indian Housing Authorities; U.S. Territory or Possession; Regional Organizations; Eligible Agencies of the Federal Government; Faith-based or Community-based Organizations.

**Agency/Department:** Department of Health and Human Services, National Institutes of Health, National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH)

**Summary:** The purpose of the NIMH Research Education Program is to foster the development of mental health researchers via creative and innovative research educational programs. The NIMH encourages educational programs that will attract, train, and advance the career development of scientists committed to research careers relevant to the mission of the NIMH. These programs may be designed as institutional, regional or national programs. The overall goal of NIMH's research training and research education programs is to ensure that highly trained scientists will be available in adequate numbers and in appropriate scientific areas to reduce the burden of mental illness, behavioral disorders, and HIV/AIDS through research on mind, brain, and behavior. Applications will be accepted in response to this funding opportunity from organizations that propose research education experiences at the following levels of professional career development: medical/graduate student, postdoctoral fellow, medical resident, and/or independent scientist. The NIMH strongly encourages all proposed programs to foster the participation of individuals from racial and ethnic groups underrepresented in biomedical and behavioral research, individuals with disabilities, and women.
