

## WHAT IS TAPP?


TAPP is a collaborative approach that helps teachers and parents identify and address student concerns by sharing input, ideas and plans for improving student success at school and home.

Using a structured process, conducted via approximately four meetings, parents and teachers:

- Prioritize a student's strengths and identify challenges that interfere with learning.
- Set goals and develop strategies that can be used at home and school.
- Implement and evaluate a joint plan at home and school.
- Monitor the student's progress toward goals.

### TAPP is characterized by:

- Trust
- Two-way communication
- Collaboration and cooperation
- Shared responsibility

## TAPP PARA FAMILIAS LATINAS

- TAPP para Familias Latinas focuses on Latino students in kindergarten through fifth grade.
- Up to three students per classroom can participate, with some classrooms receiving TAPP services and others receiving traditional supports.
- TAPP specialists facilitate meetings between a child's teacher and parents.

### Goals

- Promote students' academic and behavioral success
- Enhance parent and teacher skills
- Strengthen relationships between families and schools

## BENEFITS

### Students:

- Improved academic performance, engagement and social-behavioral skills
- Reduced problem behaviors, including defiance, noncompliance and time off-task
- Consistency across home and school

### Parents:

- Improved communication with children and teachers
- Frequent updates on how children are performing in school
- Meaningful input on classroom goals and strategies

### Teachers:

- Improved classroom climate
- Better relationships with parents
- Enhanced management skills for students with behavioral issues
