

Invitation to Participate:

You are invited to participate in a research study helping your child be more successful by working together with your child's teacher.

Teachers and Parents as Partners (TAPP) is a new way to help your child be more successful in school. Through your participation, you may earn up to \$600!

How can TAPP help my child?

- Through TAPP, students learn positive social and behavioral skills for dealing with difficulties and getting along at both home and school. And the effects of TAPP are long-lasting!
- More than 700 struggling students and teachers in hundreds of schools across the US have benefitted from TAPP.
- Students receiving TAPP performed better than two-thirds of their classmates on schoolwork, social skills, and positive behavior tests.

What does participation involve?

You will have a chance to help teachers and researchers find the best strategies for children like yours.

Your participation is completely voluntary. It involves being randomly selected to either participate in TAPP or to continue with your typical school services.

If selected for TAPP services:

- You will be asked to attend 3-4 meetings with your child's teacher and a specialist at your child's school who will lead TAPP meetings.
- You and your child's teacher will create plans to improve your child's behavior.
- You will receive up to \$600 for participation.

If selected for typical services:

- You will not be asked to attend TAPP meetings.
- Your child will continue to receive services provided by the school.
- You will receive up to \$500 for participation.

ALL participants will be asked to:

- Complete 10 brief (5-minute) telephone or text message mini-interviews.
- Complete 2 online surveys that take about 45 minutes each.
- Give permission for your child's teacher to collect 8 (30-minute) videos and complete surveys about your child's skills.
