



Parents: You're invited join our study!

You are invited to be a part of our study to help families and schools work together using a program called Teachers and Parents as Partners, or TAPP. **If you join, you can get money!**

What is TAPP?

- TAPP helps parents and teachers fix problems so kids can learn better.
- School helpers, called consultants, use TAPP to lead meetings and make plans to help kids with their behavior.

What is Tele-TAPP?

- Computers will be used to bring TAPP to your child's school. This process is called Tele-TAPP.
- Researchers from East Tennessee State University and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln are working together on this study.
- The team will test how well Tele-TAPP works in many schools in your area.

What's Involved?

You decide if you want to be part of the study or not. If you choose to join, you will be assigned to either the group that does Tele-TAPP or the group that simply continues doing their normal activities.

If you are picked for Tele-TAPP, you will:

- Join about four meetings with your child's teacher and a consultant. Parents and teachers will meet at school and the consultant will join using distance technology, like Zoom.
- Create easy plans to help your child at home.
- Be paid **\$200**.

If you are NOT picked for Tele-TAPP, you will:

- Not join any meetings.
- Your child will still get their regular help at school.
- Be paid **\$150**.

ALL parents who join should expect to:

- Answer short questions on the phone or through texts, up to 10 times.
- Do two online surveys.
- Allow the teacher to make videos at school and answer questions about your child.
- Allow researchers to check your child's school records.
