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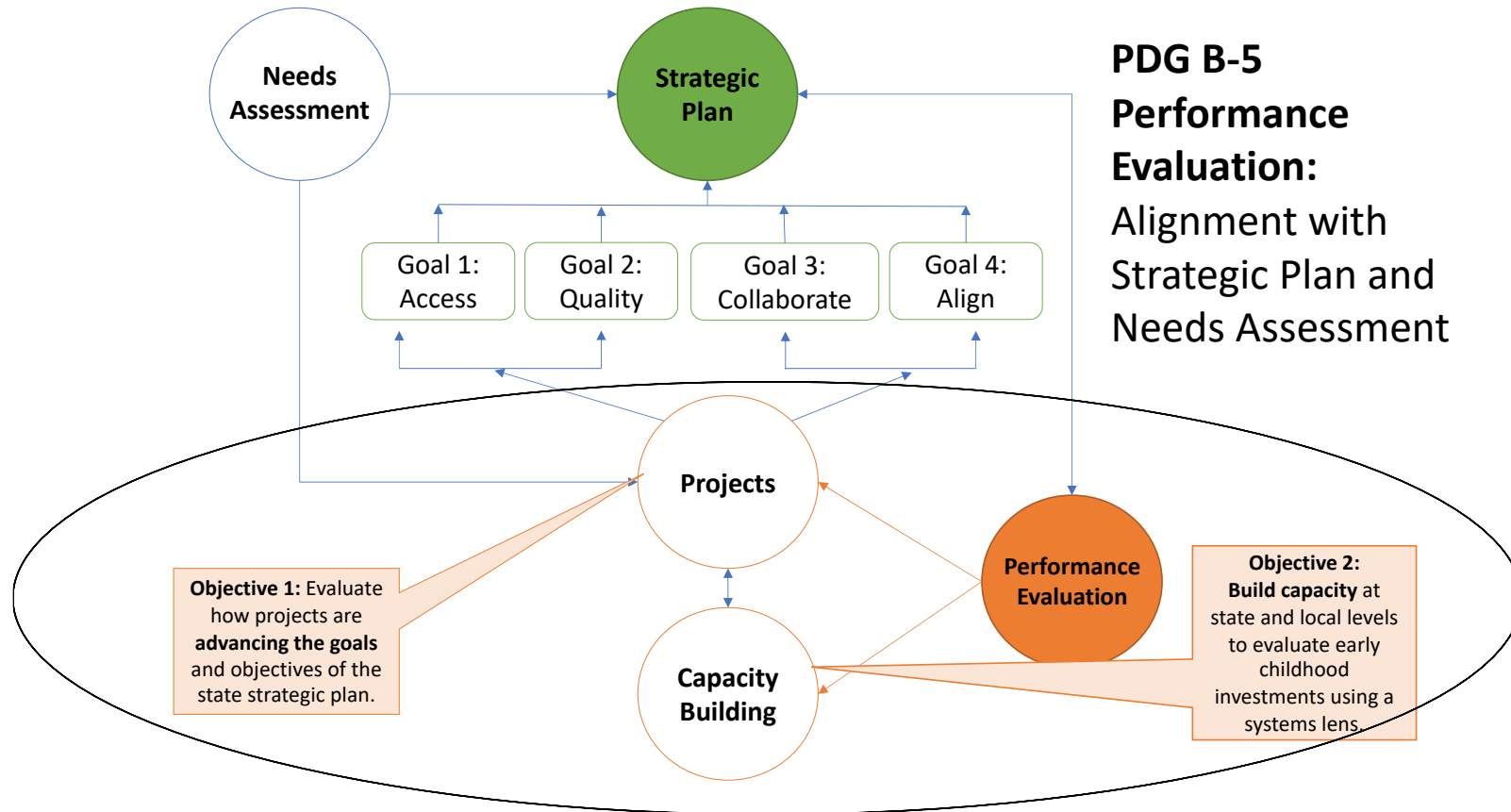

- Process: Systems Evaluation Protocol, Capacity Building Facilitation

Evaluative Thinking:

Critical thinking applied in the context of evaluation, motivated by an attitude of inquisitiveness and a belief in the value of evidence, that involves:



Identify Assumptions



Pose Thoughtful Questions



Pursue Understanding through perspective taking



Make informed decisions

Identify Assumptions

- Systems change is sometimes systems level and other times program specific
- Content about assumptions was largely about quality and access; not much about equity or collaboration
- Importance of family engagement and workforce engagement

Posing Thoughtful Questions

- What is happening in the strategic planning that influences what we are going to do?
- How well is it working? Do we need to go back and tweak what we are doing?
- How are we staying engaged with families, and what really is a powerful incentive for them?

Perspective Taking

- Collaboration
- Elevating family & provider voices
- Recognition of needing broad array of voices
- Head Start and EDN have some established practices around evaluative thinking that systems could learn & benefit from

Making Informed Decisions

- Structured evaluation plans and accountability requirements may lead to increased data utilization for continuous improvement processes and data-based decisions
- Individually funded projects used data to inform programs but rarely made connections to the larger system
- Access and quality most frequent content mentioned

Next Steps

- Share out the data collected – at the systems and project levels
- Indicate where the four pieces of evaluative thinking have played a role in shifting the system
- Build capacity for evaluative thinking through the ENT, technical assistance, and an online repository
